INTERCLUB ANNOUNCEMENT





The Icelandic Skating Association and the Reykjavik Figure Skating Club would like to invite you to participate in the Interclub Figure Skating Competition at the Reykjavik International Games 2017 (RIG). Reykjavík International Games is a multiathletic event which is hosted by Reykjavík city over a two-week period. Further information about the multisport events can be found at http://www.rig.is.

This will be the 9th year figure skating is part of the Reykjavík International Games, and the 3rd year on the list of ISU competitions. It is with great pleasure we welcome figure skaters from figure skating clubs and ISU Member Federations to participate in this interclub figure skating competition for young and upcoming skaters. The competition will take place at the same time as our ISU competition for Senior, Junior and Advanced Novice.

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

Reykjavík International Games 2017 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2016, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2016, and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the **Reykjavík International Games 2017** is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 b) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 1420 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 1420 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must to be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

Entries can be done by respective ISU Member Federations or by clubs.

2. TECHNICAL DATA

PLACE Main arena (MR): Laugardalur Ice Arena, Múlavegi 1, Reykjavík (an indoor ice-rink with the ice surface of 30 x 60 m, air-conditioned and heated)

2.1 COMPETING CATEGORIES

Competition rules for all categories will be according to the Icelandic Skating Association's National Competition Rules (see in Appendix).

Competition categories are the following:

12 years and younger A, girls	Not older than 12 on July 1, 2016	FS
13 years and younger A, boys	Not older than 13 on July 1, 2016	FS
10 years and younger A, girls	Not older than 10 on July 1, 2016	FS
11 years and younger A, boys	Not older than 11 on July 1, 2016	FS
8 years and younger A, girls	Not older than 8 on July 1, 2016	FS
9 years and younger A, boys	Not older than 9 on July 1, 2016	FS



3. ENTRIES

The Entry Forms are available on the competition's website **www.iceskate.is/rig2017**. Please e-mail Entry Forms to **events@iceskate.is**.

3.1 Entries of competitors

The entries by name should reach the organizer no later than **Friday**, **December 9**th, **2016**. The official entry form for the RIG Interclub competition must be used (**RIG06**).

Confirmation of the skaters accepted to the competition will be published on the website not later than **December 12**th, **2016**.

3.2 Entry fee

The entry fee for Senior, Junior and Advanced Novice is 60 € per participant.

The entry fee must be paid by **December 9**th, **2016** to the following bank account – we kindly ask members to make **one payment transaction for all their skaters** and mark it with the text "RIG2017".

In case a skater has been entered in the competition, but cannot participate, she/he can be replaced by another skater in the same category by another skater from the same member until **January 27**th, **2016**. Participating members are asked to immediately inform of any changes in their entries by email to **events@iceskate.is**.

Entry fees are not refunded in case of withdrawal after **December 9**th, **2016**. Entry fee will be refunded if the skater is not accepted (if there will be a limitation of the numbers of entries).

4. MEALS, LODGING and TRAVEL EXPENSES

The organizer will not cover the expenses of the teams. Travel expenses, meals and accommodation will be covered by the participants.

MUSIC / PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

All Competitors shall provide competition music of excellent quality in digital audio file. Music files must be submitted on CD or any other transportable independent free accessible medium on site at the time of registration. The medium with the music files will be kept until the end of the competition.

The CDs equipped with the competitor's full name, members name, the exact running time of the music (not skating time), competing category (short and free program) must be submitted to the Organizer at the accreditation. All competitors must have an extra copy of their music available at the rink during their event.

The "Program Content Sheet" (RIG04) must be returned with the entry form by email to events@iceskate.is no later than **December 9**th, **2016**. The Program Component Sheet must



be filled in precisely by each skater in English using the Terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

6. ARRIVAL OF PARTICIPANTS / TEAMS

All Competitors, Team Leaders, Team Officials and Coaches taking part in the competition are requested to announce to the Organizing Committee as soon as possible but no later than **January 6th**, **2017**, the name of the airlines, flight numbers, dates and times of arrival at Keflavík International Airport or any other information concerning transportation and arrivals. The travel form **RIG03** should be used. **All Officials will be picked up at Keflavík Airport.**

The main international airport in Iceland is Keflavík Airport (KEF) with a distance of 40 km from the capital. It takes approx. 50 min to go from the airport to Reykjavík with Fly-bus. Buses are available from Keflavík airport and should stop at the official hotel. Further information about the bus service can be found at https://www.re.is/flybus/.

The Accreditation is planned at the ice rink upon arrival Thursday February 2nd from 18.00-22:00 and on Friday February 3rd at 08:00.

9. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The three best placed Competitors in each event will be announced and honored. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to the medalists.

11. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole obligation of each Member participating, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious.

^{*} Note on technical score for step sequence: To reach "level Basic" the skater must show at least: 3 turns and 2 steps, use the whole ice surface and have constant flow. If not a "no value" will be given.

Program Components and Level Explanations

Categories: 8 years & younger A girls and 9 years & younger A boys and 10 years & younger A girls and 11 years & younger A boys receive marks for:

- Skating skills
- Performance / Execution

The factor of the program components is 2.5.

Levels explanations: In all elements that are subject to levels, only features up to **Level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel

Category 12 & younger girls and 13 years & younger A boys receive marks for:

- Skating skills
- Performance / Execution
- Interpretation

The factor of the program components is 1.7 for girls and 2.0 for boys Levels explanations: In all elements that are subject to levels, features up to Level 3 will be counted.
